



Greetings in the Name of the Lord!

Come October 17 to 19, 2015 the Honorable Mayor of Toyama City, Japan Mayor Mori and delegates headed by Mr. Wakabayashi of the Department of Education of Toyama Prefecture will be visiting our school, the MCNP-ISAP as an offshoot of our visit to Japan early part of last year.

Our visit was one of Appreciation and Gratitude to the Department of Education of Toyama City for its employment of our graduates of ISAP in BSED and BSBA as well as BSHRM who are conversant and well versed in their language Nihongo and were hired as Assistant English and Nihongo Teacher.

And these partnerships with different Colleges and University were made possible because ISAP and MCNP for the past 5 years have offered to our students Nihongo as our Second Language and which prompted even the Assistant Japanese Consul visit our two schools in appreciation of our Second Language Nihongo which is incorporated in our curriculum.

And in that short visit with the Department of Education as well as Mayor Mori I touched on the possibility of our City of Tuguegarao entering into a Sisterhood Partnership with Toyama City. And one offshoot of our relationship with the Department of Education of Toyama City who came to visit us 4 years ago and I brought them to the Mayor of Tabuk City and Governor of Kalinga for a possible Joint Program of Employment of Kalinga's Out of School Youth up to age 35 years old and ALS Passers wherein we shall train them on the High Technology skills as in the sector of Carpentry, Masonry and Welding.

It's been a great honor and privilege for us for such a visit from the Officials of Toyama City as we found an opportunity for us in training our people for work in Japan where the pay is almost as high as USA's rate. And modestly aside the coming of Dr. Fujii who donated 50 units of Paramount Hospital Beds as well as one Ultrasound Unit to our school and further more their coming over to talk to our Nursing students as well as Nursing Board passers of MCNP and other schools already for employment in one of the 3 hospitals and 5 Specialty Clinics he owns and operate.

May I therefore request this August Body to give us a chance to expound some more on this great opportunity to help thousands of unemployed residents of Tuguegarao and neighbor towns. And with our Lord's Blessing may I pray for a prompt response to our request for the good not only of our people who are wanting to have a better life but also an honor and privilege for a Sisterhood Relationship for the City of Tuguegarao and Toyama City, Japan.
